Although mammography is the most commonly used screening tool for breast cancer, it frequently is not enough. Mammography misses between 30 to 40 percent of breast cancers. Dr. Nancy Elliot, M.D., F.A.C.S., founder and director of Montclair Breast Center, recommends that women with dense breast tissue or breast cancer in their family have an ultrasound as well as a mammogram. Dense breast tissue appears white in mammograms, as does cancer, making it difficult to detect cancerous masses. Mammography is the way to determine if you have dense breasts.
